School Kits Needed

Soon we will see signs advertising "Back to School" sales on supplies needed for kids to start school. We have received word from Lutheran World Relief that the need for school kits is greater than ever as refugees continue to arrive in already crowded camps. School kits are sent around the world benefitting children in orphanages, areas where families can barely afford the fees necessary to send their children to school much less purchase supplies and refugee camps. Items needed for one school kit:

Four 70-sheet 8 ½ x 10 ½ inch notebooks (this size is important) wide or college ruled

One pencil sharpener

One blunt scissors (safety scissors for children with embedded steel blades)

Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers

Five black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink) One 2 ¹/₂ inch eraser

One box of 16 or 24 crayons (Crayola brand is best)

One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other

From your Pastor:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Perhaps you heard my sermon on Father's Day either in church or online and you know that I have been coached in transformational ministry. Maybe after hearing that sermon you have some questions about what transformational ministry will look like. What will change? How will our church be different? Who is going to come to church with us as a result of all of the change? Right now I have no idea how to answer any of those questions. You see, transformational ministry is a process, not a program.

In a program there are particular agenda items and protocols to follow to reach a foreseen outcome. In a process such as transformational ministry we will follow the leading of the Holy Spirit to see what God is calling us to do. God is leading us, and just like Jesus said in John 3:8, "The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you *do not know* where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." Are you OK with living in that mystery? Right now we don't know what God is calling us to do, but we DO know that God will be with us as we do it.

During the months of July and August I will be asking people to be a part of what will be called the Pilgrim Lutheran Renewal Team. This small team of about four to six people will be given the task of having conversations with you. We will be having one on one conversations with as many church members as we can and we will be comparing our answers to see what God is bringing out of those conversations as a direction to focus our energy. This will be a total congregational effort because you will either be a member of the renewal team or a conversation partner with one. Since there are lots of people who are part of this church and there will be lots of conversations, I expect this whole process to take several months, so I will appreciate your patience as we listen to each other and listen to God.

In the meantime I think we will continue doing things well. We have embraced many new things in the past few months and we will embrace new things in the future, and God will be with us, as God makes all things new. As Paul wrote in 2 Corinthians, "So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ, God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting the message of reconciliation to us. So we are ambassadors for Christ!" How do you like that? You are an ambassador for Christ! Now, let's see what Christ asks us to do for his sake.


