From your Pastor:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

When the calendar page turns to September sometimes I am filled with mixed emotions. See if you can relate to my thinking. I want to hold on to the more relaxed pace of summer, but at the same time I am really looking forward to some of the fall activities that are coming up. I enjoyed a summer of hiking, kayaking, travel, beachcombing and playing my ukulele, but now it is time to embrace the many activities that have been planned over the past few months, and there are a lot of things calling our attention forward into fall. All of this makes me think of what King David wrote in the Psalm "I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the Lord." (Psalm 122:1) In September we will return to one service at 10 am so we can all be together as one body of Christ.

September 10th we will host the second annual 'Blessing of the First Responders'. One thing that will be a little different this year is that we will hold our entire worship service outside in the parking lot (weather permitting) so that we can feature the first response vehicles as a part of showering our responders with God's blessing. It is our privilege to honor those people who risk their lives for the sake of our shared community. I am looking forward to a chance to thank God for their service and thank them for their willingness to answer God's call.

September 17th is Rally Sunday. Sunday school classes will resume with the exception of the Adult Forum. The team of Sunday school staff have prepared a very nice curriculum for our students and activities are planned that will help the students prepare for our big Reformation Celebration coming up in October.

The last weekend in September will be a great time to get together and really enjoy each other's company. We will be going to Camp Lutherhaven for our All Church Retreat. It will be a chance to encounter some spiritual refreshment and some recreation as we get ready for a fall full of church celebrations. You may be wondering why we want to have a retreat. The answer is also found in Psalm 122, "Pray for the peace of Jerusalem: "May they prosper who love you. 'Peace be within your walls, and security within your towers.' For the sake of my relatives and friends I will say, 'Peace be within you.' For the sake of the house of the LORD our God, I will seek your good." Remember the deadline to register for the retreat is September 10th. This will give the staff at Lutherhaven time to prepare for our arrival and make appropriate arrangements for us.

The whole purpose of all of these events is simple; to build up the body of Christ, the Church. We are called to spread God's word of love throughout the world and for the whole of Fall we will be exploring practical ways we are doing that in our community, our church family and even globally. I know you will be blessed in your participation. See you in church.




A Word About our Mission Budget
