Then our investment counselor developed cancer, was suddenly out of the picture and his replacement that we were just getting used to came see us in our home 2 weeks ago and when we called to ask a question the next day, learned that he had resigned suddenly. From Our Pastor:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On the church calendar, now that we have reached June, we have entered what the church calls 'Ordinary Time.' Some churches call it the time after Pentecost, but either way, the church does not celebrate any major festivals from now until Reformation Sunday in October.


