March Message From Our Pastor:

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The old saying goes that March comes in like a lion and goes out like a lamb, but I think this year we can make our March animal a beaver. Beavers have a reputation for being busy. There is even a simile that compares a busy person to being a busy as a beaver, and there are a lot of activities planned for the month of March.

March 3rd, the very first Sunday of March, is Transfiguration Sunday. It is the final Sunday in the season after Epiphany. We will close out the season after Epiphany with our traditional Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper on March 5th, serving the people of Othello between 5 and 7 pm. We begin Lent on Ash Wednesday, March 6th . The Service of the Imposition of Ashes will be at 7 pm. Ash Wednesday Service marks the beginning of all our Lenten activities.

Beginning on March 13th we will have our Wednesday evening Soup and Bread Suppers in the Fellowship Hall with a brief Lenten Message following the meal. There are five Wednesday Evening Soup and Bread Suppers. Please try to attend as many as you are able.

This year, to provide for those who are seeking some time for meditation, we will be offering Thursday Evening Meditation in the Meditation Room Library at 7 pm during Lent. This will be a more contemplative service with Scripture readings, prayers and quiet choruses. The goal will be to give participants an escape from the hectic pace of life for a short time each Thursday. Feel free to give it a try.

Each weekend in March will have some activity going on also. March 9th is the city-wide cleanup. We will check in with the Beautification Committee at 8 am and gather materials at the Othello School District parking lot on First Avenue and then clean up 14th Avenue. This year the annual St. Patrick's Day Open House at the Parsonage will be on Saturday, March 16th from 2 to 4 pm. This is to accommodate the Celebration of the Arts that is March 17th at 2 pm at First Presbyterian Church. This annual celebration is an ecumenical event to thank God for all the talent we have in Othello. March 22nd, 23rd and 24th are the dates for the Sandhill Crane Festival. You could be fed more pancakes by some of your fellow church members who are part of the Rotary Club, who will host a pancake breakfast on Saturday the 23rd at the high school. Keep stacking up your loose change because on March 31st we will end worship with another noisy offering. Proceeds will go the quilters to purchase batting for quilts and offset their shipping costs when they send quilts all over the world wherever disaster strikes.

As you can see, March is a busy month, so I'm adopting the beaver as the animal of the month. Being busy isn't a bad thing either, when we are doing the work God has called us to do. Paul wrote in 1 Thessalonians, "Finally, brothers and sisters, we ask and urge you in the Lord Jesus that, as you learned from us how you ought to live and to please God (as, in fact, you are doing), you should do so more and more.
