Quilt distribution this year was 231 to LWR, 25 Othello Christmas Baskets, 20 California fires, 23 various local donations, and 3 were purchased. April 29, we packed 138 quilts for shipping. This time also is filled with laughter and joy. Thank you to everyone who helps make our guilts, purchases our guilts, and helps with the shipping.

The volunteers continue to amaze me with their dedication and desire to guilt. They laugh, they tease, and they produce quilts galore. Linda Boothman is new to our group. She donated fabric that had spent 40 years in her attic. (Indeed, it is an interesting story.) She helped cut the fabric into squares; she sewed some of the fabric into quilt tops; she fell in love with a lovely quilt that touched her heart; and bought that quilt for \$100. Donate it, sew it, and then buy it - wow! Jean Thomson takes home our oddball squares and funny shaped pieces of fabric. Each week she returns with from one to three quilt tops. Even though we lovingly call them our scrappy guilts, they have also made Quilt of the Week. Donna O'Dell who will celebrate her 100th birthday on May 5 is one amazing quilter. Until recently, she sat next to her daughter. Sandy. each week sewing and sharing gardening tips, stories, and being a guidepost for the rest of us. We all marvel at her grace. The newsletter space keeps me from telling a story about each volunteer. But oh, they have good stories and good hearts. We are blessed.

Once again at the end of May, Linda Crosier will open her home to our end-of-the-year potluck. We gather in her backyard to enjoy the various dishes, her lovely garden, and each other. And there will be someone who says, "I will miss quilting, so when do we start again in August?"

May Message From Our Pastor:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

A few times each year we recite Psalm 23 in worship, but I particularly like it when we recite it on the fourth Sunday of Easter, which is always "Good Shepherd Sunday". It seems most meaningful when we read the text from the tenth chapter of John where Jesus says, "I am the Good Shepherd" right after we have acknowledged "The Lord is my Shepherd." I like the strong connection between the Old Testament psalm of David and the New Testament statement of Jesus, but even more than that, I like the personal connection of acknowledging Jesus as MY shepherd.

Jesus is the one who gathers his flock safely in the pasture. Jesus is the one who makes sure we are fed and cared for. Jesus is the one who risks, and even gives up, his own life to make sure we receive the message of salvation. Jesus does all of this out of love; and not just any love, but God's abundant divine love.

The love that binds the universe together is the same love that gathers the church. The love that led Jesus to the cross for our sake is the same love that feeds the church on the bread and wine that is the body and blood of Christ at communion. The love that comes upon the disciples at Pentecost is the same love that comes upon us as we share the words of Jesus, "Peace be with you," and reply, "And also with you."

This year, through a miraculous confluence of events which can only be the work of the Holy Spirit, we have a unique opportunity on Good Shepherd Sunday. It is also the same day we celebrate Mother's Day. As we celebrate how our Good Shepherd loves us, we will also remember the warmth of our own mother's love and how she nurtured us and sacrificed for us to give us a healthy life.

We will also experience how God's love travels throughout the world. On May 12th we will have the opportunity to meet Moses Nwaka from our companion synod in Tanzania. He will be here and bring greetings and the message for the day as we acknowledge our common Shepherd, Jesus, who transcends time, space and distance to make us one body of Christ throughout the world.

It will be a special day for us and I am strongly encouraging you to come and meet Moses, come and hear how our companion synod is growing and experiencing God's amazing love, and come to feel the embrace of Jesus, our Good Shepherd, who calls us by name; who says, "My sheep hear my voice. I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they will never perish. No one will snatch them out of my hand." (John 10:27-28) Come because Jesus is calling you. See you in church.
