Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I must admit to you that I am already thinking about my vacation coming up in the middle of this month. Anna and I will be spending a few days with my sons on the Oregon coast, and I am already looking forward to it. I hope I am not too distracted with planning to pay attention to what we have going around here! I am looking forward to the activities we have planned while we are there. We will be walking along the beach, flying kites, having sing-alongs with ukulele and guitar, probably roasting things on a fire, and touring the area including the Tillamook cheese factory. (Anna has already admitted to me that she is really more interested in the ice cream than the cheese.) I will tell you all how it went when we return.

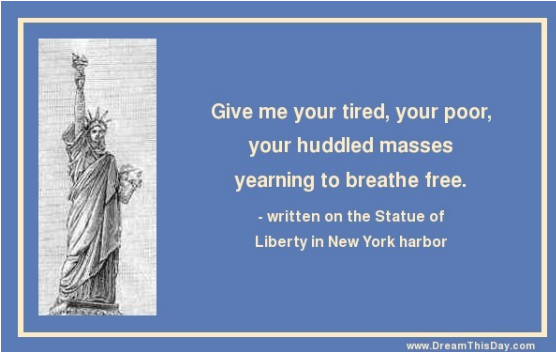
