May 2020 Message from our Pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We have not had worship together in the church building since March 15th. Did you realize that? You have been attending worship online for well over a month now! I have heard lots of comments about your online worship experiences as Anna and I have been in conversation with some of you. I am grateful that you are willing to attend worship in this virtual community, held together with the electronic means of computers and the Internet. I am grateful that, for the most part, you are engaged and positive about the online worship service. I am grateful for the way many of you share our online services with friends and relatives. You are great ambassadors for Pilgrim Lutheran Church.

I have heard some of you say, "I can worship in my pajamas! Isn't that great!" "I can worship on MY schedule because the videos are saved for viewing anytime." "I can worship for a while, pause the recording and use the restroom or get a sandwich, come back to the computer and I haven't missed anything; it's great!" But as pleased as I am with your online presence, I understand your impatience for a return to the familiar surroundings of the church building.

I have also heard someone say, "When can we go back to having 'real' church again?" Another person said, "The online services are great, but I sure do miss the people!" And another comment was, "The advantage to having church in the church building is being able to say 'hi' to all of my friends and have a cup of coffee together after church." I totally get it. Online services are not as good as being there in person. Many people want to know when this pandemic will end. When will the government lift the stay at home order? When can we get back to church? How long will we have to wait until we can have church again? The answer, of course, is that it is up to Governor Inslee. Despite the protests, the regional governments in some counties defying state orders, and some television personalities, we will not gather in the building until it is safe to do so. I have been in consultation with Bishop Kuempel on this matter, and her response was, "Just a heads up: I'm going to be VERY conservative in my recommendations around in-person worship. We're seeing too many spikes after lifting of quarantines in other parts of the world."

Be patient. We will be together again in God's time. We will be able to have coffee together again, sing songs together again, share the joy of the Lord together again when God is ready to bring us together again. I have to believe God is teaching us something in this pandemic. Perhaps God is reminding us that the church is not the building; the church is the people. Perhaps God is telling us that gathering for worship is something that can happen in a variety of ways. Perhaps God is doing something new with us, as it says in 2 Corinthians, "So, if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation." (2 Corinthians 5:17-18) Hang in there, new creation!

God is still at work in us, with us and through us. Thanks be to God!
