Newsletter Article for December 2024

Dear Pilgrims,

Did you notice that the Christmas commercials started before Halloween this year? Some stores had Christmas decorations filling sales aisles by Labor Day. I am all in favor of planning ahead, but that seems a little extreme, at least to me. Perhaps you appreciate the sales of Christmas decorations while wearing sunscreen, but I have to admit, I was a bit taken aback.

Of course, I'm more of the last-minute type. I think you can picture it; on December 24th, around noon I may have finally figured out what Anna should get for Christmas. I then rush right out to the nearest variety store, in this town that's Walmart, and look for said item that I believe in my mind will be perfect. Of course, Walmart has been out of stock on that particular item for about two weeks, so I'm out of luck, out of time, and out of options. I have to settle for something else that may or may not be appreciated by my lovely wife, but it's my own fault for having waited until the last minute.

Does that scenario sound at all familiar? It probably does to a few men in Othello, or maybe it really is just me. I get so caught up in all of the Christmas activities that I forget about the most important part. I forget about the time spent in the company of loved ones. That really is the heart of what Christmas is all about, when you think about why God sent Jesus to live among us in the first place.

In the first chapter of the gospel of John the fourteenth verse says, "The Word became flesh and lived among us." God, the One who is the everlasting Word, the one who embodies love because God is love (1John 4:8), God came to live among the people God loves.

Now, John warned us that the presence of God among us was not all sunshine and roses before John even

mentioned that God set up shop in the neighborhood. Back in verse 10 of that same first chapter in John he wrote, "He was in the world, and the world came into being through him, yet the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him."

That is the tragedy of human existence. We have lost our relationship with God. We severed our relationship through sin. We were tempted by Satan, and we failed to resist, and as a result we are sinners in need of forgiveness. We cannot restore our relationship with God on our own, no matter how hard we try. Our own efforts to get in right relationship with God fail because we cannot remove the power of sin without God's help. That's why Jesus had to come.

Jesus HAD to come to restore our relationship with God through his own sacrifice. Jesus HAD to come in order to hang out with the people God loves and share the love of God directly with us so that we have a foretaste of the feast to come. Jesus HAD to come to bring us the gifts of Holy Communion, the body and blood of Christ to eat and drink. It is through those gifts we are cleansed from sin and our relationship with God is restored.

That is why Christmas is so important. Through the gift of God's own Son at Christmas, our relationship with God is restored and we are free to live without sin, free to live without the fear of death, free to live and share God's love with others so that God's presence and power increase on earth until all people are gathered into God's fold of grace and mercy. So, get your Christmas shopping done early, and cherish the people you love. That is a Christmas to remember. See you in church or online.
