Newsletter Article for January 2025

Dear Pilgrims,

Happy New Year!

Do you realize that, even as we begin a new year on our calendars, we are still celebrating Christmas? The festival of Christmas lasts twelve days, from December 25th until January 5th, and ends with the Feast of Epiphany on January 6th. Here in the United States, we don't celebrate Epiphany much, but in some parts of the world, such as Spain, Belgium, Greece, and elsewhere, Epiphany is the occasion where children are Philip explains the book of Isaiah to an Ethiopian given gifts, rather than at Christmastime. As a matter of fact, in Spain, children write letters to the three kings and make their gift requests rather than to Santa Claus. None of this information will change how we celebrate Christmas at Pilgrim, but I find it fascinating to learn more about different cultures, and the diversity of traditions that all fit under the great umbrella of Christianity.

Here in the United States, much of our Christmas and New Year's celebrations are centered around a generalized idea of how Christmas is celebrated in much of the country. At least at my house, many of the cards I received this year showed pictures of a snowy church, or maybe a sleigh in the snow, or even a whole village blanketed in white powder. It makes for a pretty picture, but it is hardly the reality of Christmas in Miami or Houston. It's also pretty rare for snow to blanket the cities of Seattle and Tacoma. But the snow scene fits into the generalized narrative of a white Christmas, so we send and receive cards like that.

Even in the Bible, there are plenty of examples of diversity. In the book of Luke, Jesus tells the story of a Samaritan man who cares for a Judean who has been

beaten by robbers and left for dead at the side of the road. The crowd listening to Jesus is shocked because the Judeans and Samaritans didn't associate with each other because of petty religious differences. The gospel of John emphasizes this, saying that Jews do not share things in common with Samaritans, and then later explaining that the Samaritans worship on Mount Gerizim while the Jews worship at the Temple in Jerusalem. But in his interaction with the Samaritan woman, Jesus explains that the true worship of God is spiritual and is not tied to a specific place.

Acts expands the idea of diversity in chapter 8 when eunuch. Such a person would not have been welcome in the temple in Jerusalem, but Philip baptizes him on the roadside and welcomes him into the fellowship of Christianity. There are other examples of diversity in the new Christian church of the New Testament, and I encourage you to read it for yourself. You will discover that the church has always welcomed a variety of people, along with their cultural differences, and we have worked together to form the body of Christ.

If you want to give your loved ones a gift on Epiphany, to honor those cultures who embrace that tradition, you're welcome to do that, but more importantly, I would like to encourage you to spend this year with an emphasis on embracing diversity. Get to know those who are different from yourself. Learn from them about their unique culture and the celebrations that are different from what you are used to. You just might find yourself enjoying it! May God bless you throughout this New Year.
