Newsletter Article for March 2025

Dear Pilgrims,

If there was ever a month where we share multiple opportunities for fun, March has to be it. We begin the month at worship on March 2nd, and we celebrate all the birthdays and anniversaries of the month. On March 4th we celebrate Shrove Tuesday with our annual Pancake Supper. Tradition holds that Shrove Tuesday was initiated so that people could use up their forbidden foods that day so they wouldn't spoil over Lent. Of course, today we have modern refrigeration and storage facilities, so that is much less of an issue, but the tradition remains, and sharing an evening of fellowship and pancakes is fun! If you've ever been in the kitchen with those who prepare and serve the food that evening, I'm not sure who has more fun, those who serve or those who are served. Come and join in the fun and you'll see what I mean.

I know most people have trouble associating Lent with fun, but even though we will spend the bulk of the month of March in the season of Lent, I think this year it will be fun. Yes, we begin the season of Lent on Ash Wednesday, March 5th with the words, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you will return", which is a rather depressing reference to our own mortality, but rather than dwell on the inevitability of our own demise, this year we will celebrate the gifts God has given us in our own five senses.

There are five midweek Lenten services, and each service will focus on one of our five different senses. We will spend time reflecting on how God has gifted us with these senses and how each of those senses is given to truly enjoy God's creation. We will read scripture passages that

remind us of how the people of God have used their senses to learn from God and to follow Jesus, and how even just using our senses is a way to worship our Lord. I think it will be fun, and along with the focus on the senses, we also get to enjoy soup, bread, and fellowship. So, join in the fun!

The last Sunday in March is Casual Sunday, and we will take a less formal approach to our worship of God. Music will be a bit more casual and hopefully familiar and uplifting, and even the way Holy Communion is served is a bit more casual. Even in the midst of our casual attitudes, Jesus still makes his presence known, and God still reveals the perfect love God has for all of us. I sincerely hope you will be able to participate in the events your church planning teams have prepared for you. I think you will find a blessing as you come into God's holy house.
